I would like to mention that the Bharatiya Chhatra Sansad Foundation and MIT School of Government, Pune, have been bringing together students from across the country in an Annual Conclave called Bharatiya Chhatra Sansad (Indian Students' Parliament). 10 such annual events have already been organized with great success.
